Online Safe Sanctuary Training Available in Mid-August

The CTC now has an online Safe Sanctuaries Training for local church leaders and volunteers who will be working with children, youth and vulnerable adults. This course is not meant to replace the local church's face-to-face training. Rather, it is hoped that this will be an option for those who, for any reason, are unable to attend the regularly scheduled training a local church provides. The conference estimates that it will require about four to six hours to complete the online training, but those who wish to complete their training online will have up to one month to complete it at their own pace and on their preferred schedule. Upon completion, the participant will be able to print a certificate to present to their Safe Sanctuaries coordinator or the equivalent in their local church. The person who chooses this training will need the book Safe Sanctuaries by Joy Melton to be able to successfully complete it. Most local churches have this book, but it can be purchased through the Cokesbury store or at www.cokesbury.com. The first scheduled opportunity to take the online course will begin on Aug. 15, and it should be completed by Sept. 15. Are You a Potential Centennial Church?

Tapping into this year's centennial theme — the 100th anniversary of the CTC — a "Centennial Church" will be a designation given to congregations reaching certain achievements and will be celebrated at the 2011 Annual Conference June 5-8 in Waco.

How does a local congregation become a Centennial Church? A Centennial Church will have a score of 100 based on the completion of challenges listed below. Each challenge has a numerical value. Between Sept. 1, 2010 and May 1, 2011, a church may select challenges from the list and will receive the designation of Centennial Church with a score of 100.

- 20 pts. Pay 100% of 2010 apportionments
- 20 pts. 25% Increase in the number of Church Growth & Development SHARES
(see SHARES listed in the *2010 Conference Journal*)
- 15 pts. Participate in the Cabinet "Weigh Down Challenge" for No More Malaria
- 10 pts. 10% increase the number of professions of faith
- 10 pts. 5% increase in average worship attendance
- 10 pts. 5% increase in Sunday school attendance
- 10 pts. Start a new hands-on community mission
- 10 pts. Start one new small group (Sunday School Class, Bible Study Group, etc.)
- 10 pts. Offer a class on the meaning and practice of tithing
- 10 pts. Conduct welcoming training using Igniting Ministries resources (such as Beyond 30 Seconds/Welcoming and Media Planner/Trainers' Toolbox/etc.)
- 10 pts. Develop a plan for "making disciples" of members and new members (youth and adults)
- 10 pts. Develop an "evangelism plan" that outlines how your church will offer Christ to your community and grow your congregation.

How will Centennial Churches be recognized? Centennial Churches will receive a certificate suitable for framing, be listed in the news outlets (Website, Central Link, E-Link) and recognized during the 2011 Annual Conference.
