Tennessee Flood Update

Ashland, Carthage and Centerville, Dyersburg and Millington may be towns unfamiliar to many across the United States, but they are among the scores of towns in Tennessee that continue to deal with the aftermath of record-breaking floods earlier this month. Twenty-four people died and 45 counties were declared disaster areas. While local churches open their doors to host volunteer work teams, the UM Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is on the ground helping the Tennessee and Memphis Conferences develop processes for coordinating response to the disaster and for offering spiritual and emotional care. No longer grabbing national headlines, the historic floods in Tennessee have left an aftermath of need for repair and rebuilding. GLOBAL: World Refugee Day Is June 20

Dawn Evans and her husband Chris wanted to get involved in hospitality ministry when they moved to their new home in Hanover, Pa. They became interested in refugee resettlement and, with their pastor's support, they invited the Lohr's Memorial UMC congregation to help. Before long, Lohr's UMC welcomed not one family from Bhutan but three. Evans and other congregants scrambled to locate apartments and furnish them for a total of 17 refugees. "It has been such a blessing," Evans said. HAITI: Emergency School Tents

Hundreds of school administrators and teachers and thousands of students perished in Haiti's Department l'Ouest during the Jan. 12 earthquake. Schools in the province were damaged or completely destroyed, leaving surviving children with no class to go to, and teachers unable to teach. UMCOR is responding by setting up emergency classroom tents for six primary schools in Tabarre Issa and one in Corail, which will benefit a total of 1,870 students and 52 teachers. UMCOR also will provide chairs, desks, and tables, as well as school kits from UMCOR Sager Brown relief depot. Since the earthquake four months ago, generous donors have given more than \$33 million to UMCOR's relief and recovery work in Haiti.
