News Briefs — The Conference

BREAKING NEWS: 1/3 of Churches Registered for Fall Leadership Summit

As of today, 118 churches (with a total of 825 church leaders) are registered for the Fall Leadership Summit Nov. 14 at First UMC, Mansfield. That number represents more than half of Bishop Lowry's goal of 200 churches represented at an event that's intended to help churches become fruitful congregations. Speaker Bishop Robert Schnase will be taking his *Five Practices for Fruitful Congregations* to the next level of engagement.

But due to the large numbers, and more expected by registration end, the agenda must be modified to EXCLUDE the breakout discussion groups on each of the "five fruitful practice" areas. Instead, the conference Web site will carry a blog site for each of those areas beginning Saturday, Nov. 14. Some of the "best practices" presenters for the breakouts will share their ideas and invite others to share their successes or ask questions. These will be open forums, so anyone may participate in one or more of the dialogues.

Transparency Is High Priority for Alignment Task Force

As the Alignment Task Force begins its work, members set as a priority regular communication with churches and conference members. They are charged with examining the conference alignment of resources and the organization of the Annual Conference and districts to ensure faithfulness and fruitfulness in ministry that we might make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Their purpose is not to strengthen or restructure what we have, but to create something new.

So that all may follow their process and share in the excitement of the developing a new way of doing ministry — a system that focuses on energizing and equipping local churches — a blog site has been set up on the conference Web site (www.ctcumc.org). Pat Stroman and Rev. Mike Ramsdell will be doing the updates each time the group meets and to reveal new research findings.

Insurance Reminder from Conference Trustees

The Conference Board of Trustees reminds participants of the **conference policy requiring each church in a charge to carry Workers' Compensation Insurance on pastors and other employees**. If a pastor or other worker receives a work-related injury, health insurance will not pay on what should be a worker's compensation claim. In addition, regular liability insurance will not pay or protect a church against such a gap in coverage. For those who may be unaware, there are conference-wide insurance programs available for the purchase of Workers' Compensation and Directors and Officers Liability insurance. Both programs are available to all CTC churches. Churches currently participating in this program have experienced reduced costs in their church insurance budgets. Standard hygiene practices such as washing hands frequently, the upkeep of hygiene supplies like alcohol-based sanitizers, antibacterial cleaning supplies, and proper disposal of waste materials are outlined.
